

# *Executive Proclamation*

## *State of South Dakota*

### *Office of the Governor*

*Whereas*, May 25 has annually been declared National Missing Children's Day; and,

*Whereas*, The Missing Children Act of 1982 was the first federal law to address this issue, and, in 1983, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed the first Missing Children's Day; and,

*Whereas*, Families and friends of missing children join together to plan events in communities across America to raise public awareness about the issue of missing children; and,

*Whereas*, Children are our most valuable asset, our link to the future, and their protection and safety deserve our utmost attention and priority; and,

*Whereas*, In 2010, on 1,092 occasions, children were reported missing in the state of South Dakota, and locating and returning these children to their homes is a statewide, national, and international objective; and,

*Whereas*, Law enforcement agencies across the state have made a commitment to missing children by forming and participating in the statewide Amber Alert Plan, Endangered Persons Advisory, and Child Abduction Response Team to train, prepare, and respond to event a child is abducted in South Dakota; and,

*Whereas*, The state of South Dakota shows its commitment to the improved safety and recovery of missing children by our participation in the Interstate Advisory Council for Missing and Exploited Children:

*Now, Therefore, I, Dennis Daugaard*, Governor of the state of South Dakota, do hereby proclaim May 25, 2011, as

in South Dakota.
